





Key Words	Definitions
Invasion	The movement on an army taken to conquer or take over that country.
Empire	A group of countries under a single authority 'The Roman Empire'
BCE	Before Common Era
AD	Anno Domini
CE	Common Era
Auxiliary soldiers	People recruited from non-Roman tribes to reinforce the army or provide a specific skill. The Latin word 'auxilium' means 'help'.
Colosseum	Massive amphitheatre in Rome.
Amphitheatre	Where gladiator fights, animal hunts and theatre shows happened
Conquered	To overcome and take control of (a place or people) by military force
Mosaic	a pattern produced by arranging together small pieces of stone
Villa	A large farm with a big house for the owners

Romulus and Remus 	Roman myths tell us of the important story where two brother argue about where to build a new country (Rome).
Julius Caesar 	Roman military general who invaded Britain
Emperor Claudius 	Roman Emperor.
Boudica 	Queen of Iceni Tribe

Juno 	The wife of Jupiter, Queen of the Gods and Goddess of women.
Hadrian's Wall 	Is in Northern England and was built to mark the boundaries of the Roman Empire and to keep the Scots out.
