You will find the spelling rules we will cover this term on the back of this sheet. *Spelling Frame* will still be available for the children to log onto to practise the appropriate spellings.

Poetry

Roald Dahl served as a pilot during WW2 and wrote poems about his experiences. Imagine you're a pilot/solider at Dunkirk during WWII. Write a poem describing your experiences.

Letter

Imagine that you are an evacuee who has been sent away from their family to live in the country during World War II. Write a letter home to your family, describing your new life in the country and how you feel about it.

Newspaper report

Research a significant event during WWII and write a newspaper report about it. You could choose to write about Dunkirk, the Blitz, the Battle of Britain or any other event.

Recount

Write about something that you did over the summer holidays, on a weekend since you've been back at school, or at school.

Free writing time!

This week, you can choose your own piece of writing. You might want to write another poem or a song. You could write a recount of your weekend, a non-chronological report, a story, or even create a comic!

Narrative

Write a story based on anything that interests you. You could base your story on a book that you've read, a game that you like to play, or on our World War 2 topic.
