#### **Duxford Recount**

After our trip to Duxford, write a recount of your day. Think about what you did throughout the day, anything you enjoyed seeing and anything new that you learned.

#### Free writing time!

This week, you can choose your own piece of writing. You might want to write another poem or a song. You could write a recount of your weekend, a non-chronological report, a story, or even create a comic!

#### Narrative

Write a story based on anything that interests you. You could base your story on a book that you've read, a game that you like to play, or on our World War 2 topic.
