<p><b>Quiz</b></p> <p>Create a quiz about the Ancient Mayans. Include at least eight questions in your quiz. Make sure you prepare the answers separately.</p>	<p><b>Wordsearch</b></p> <p>Choose one of the spelling rules we will be learning this half term and create your own wordsearch. Don't forget to write a list of the words at the bottom. See if someone can complete your wordsearch at home!</p>	<p><b>Dear Diary...</b></p> <p>Research what life was like for the Ancient Mayans. Using this information, write a diary entry imagining that you were a Mayan. Think about what they would do throughout the day.</p>
<p><b>Mayan Gods &amp; Goddesses</b></p> <p>The Maya worshipped many gods. Mayan gods could change themselves into human and animal shapes. Research some Mayan Gods and Goddesses. Write a fact file about your favourite(s), including illustrations.</p>	<p><b>Magnificent Masks!</b></p> <p>Research Mayan masks and write an information text about them. Think about what they were used for, what they were made from and what they looked like. If you are feeling creative, try designing and making your own Mayan mask using materials such as clay, card or papier mâché.</p>	<p><b>What's for dinner?</b></p> <p>What did Ancient Mayans eat? Make a list of foods that were eaten by the Ancient Mayans. Choose three of the food items. What interesting facts can you find out about each item? Where can you find them today? How might they be used in cooking? You can present this in a way of your choosing.</p>
