The Easter holidays are an egg-citing time for many children, it can also bring lots of changes, unexpected routines and big feelings. Here are some helpful ways to support pupils during this time:

Help children understand what is happening and when

Use visual supports such as timetables, calendars, or simple picture sequences to show upcoming events. Provide as much information as possible prior to events to help reduce anxiety and apprehension. Adding in countdowns can also help children have an understanding of how far into the future something is happening.

Top tip: Use a blank calendar and cross off the days to an event.

Provide plenty of opportunities for movement

Spring is the perfect time to get outside and move our bodies. Structured movement activities help children regulate. So whatever the weather put on the appropriate clothing, go outside and have fun.

Top tip: Go for an Easter Egg Hunt or jump in muddy puddles like Peppa Pig!

Keep familiar routines in place where possible

With so many fun activities, consistency becomes even more important. Continue to refer to the visual timetable so learners know what to expect and the day remains predictable.

Reduce sensory overload where necessary

Holidays, family visits, Easter parties, eating lots of sweets and chocolates are great fun but can also overstimulate children. Ensure you have thought of calming activities or spaces to help children regulate.

Top tip: Have a grab bag with you. In this it can be items that helps to regulate the child (blanket, toys, snacks etc.)

Give advance notice of changes

Let pupils know ahead of time so they can process the information and prepare for the change.

These small adjustments can make a big difference in helping all children feel calm, supported, and included throughout the Spring break.

Wilderness Foundation will be running our Neurodiversity Outdoor Camp on **Thursday 2nd and Friday 10th April**, from 10am-3pm for young people age between 9-14 at £80 **per participant per day**.

The Neurodiversity Outdoor Camp is for young people experiencing challenges with mental health, behaviour and neurodiversity needs. Many young people can present with all these challenges together and we are increasingly aware that we need to support those with neurodiversity in a more dedicated and focused way. We have traditionally organised holiday camps and, recognising increasing needs for families and young people, we are running a specialist camp for those with neurodivergent needs.

The camp aims to develop personal skills, resilience, communication, social skills and a lot more. We cook on an open fire, are creative, adventurous and accepting. A range of outdoor activities that may include one of the following, cooking, art, bushcraft, nature walks, and crafts. We will also encourage positive social engagement and group skills, using a strength-based approach which helps participants become more aware of what they do well.

It will be a small group with not more than 8 participants and advance bookings are required.

The money raised from all events has enabled us to buy resources for the school that help our children grow, explore and thrive. We are thrilled to see the PlayPod getting lots of enjoyment already. Children love playing with the resources encouraging lots of imaginative play. Plans are also underway for an outdoor classroom and forest area. We're not quite there with the fundraising for this yet but we hope that the sponsored run will contribute to this. We would appreciate your support in helping us reach our goal.

We have also provided 16 new keyboards for music lessons, tools and equipment for the gardening club, supplies for the recent Sublime Science Day, props for the Year 3 and Year 4 production as well as purchasing items from the teacher 'wish lists' to provide resources for each classroom.

Our FOM team are doing a terrific job to ensure we raise money to continue to provide these much-enjoyed resources. 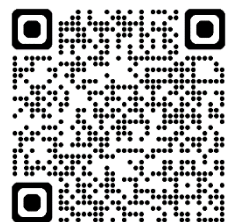
